Person(s) performing burn must attend fire at all times until fire is extinguished.

CALL FIRE DISPATCH AT (928) 855-4111 BEFORE AND AFTER BURNING

Materials that **CANNOT** be burned [A.A.C.R18-2-602.D.A.13]:

- All treated wood including: Chemically treated or painted wood, railroad ties, telephone poles
- All plastic and rubber material including: Bottles for household chemicals, Grocery and retail bags, tires
- All waste petroleum products including: Waste crankcase oil, Transmission or used oil, Oil filters
- Containers that have contained: Pesticides, Lead, Cadmium, mercury, or arsenic compounds
- Hazardous waste products including: Paints, stains, varnishes, pesticides, solvents, cleaners
- Other Prohibited Burning Materials: Household waste/garbage, Oleander, Polyester products, Tar paper, Ammunition, Poinson Oak, Poison sumac, Poison Ivy, Electrical wire insulation, Aerosol spray cans, Explosives, Thermal insulation, Composite counter tops, Flammable liquids, Asphalt shingles, Asbestos, Batteries, Anti-freeze, Transformer oils, Linoleum flooring.

CALL FIRE DISPATCH AT (928) 855-4111 BEFORE AND AFTER BURNING

Person(s) Performing Burn can only conduct open burning during low wind conditions, and during atmospheric conditions that prevent dispersion of smoke into populated areas, prevent visibility impairments on roads or at airports that result in a safety hazard, do not create a public nuisance or adversely affect public safety, do not cause adverse impact to visibility in a Class I area, and do not cause uncontrollable spreading of the fire. Person(s) performing Burn must start fire using items that do not cause the production of black smoke.

Burning cannot be conducted when an air stagnation advisory has been issued by the National Weather Service for the area. Burning cannot be conducted when any stage air pollution episode has been declared.

This permit shall not be construed to relieve the Applicant from liability resulting from damages or the obligation to comply with other applicable laws, regulations, or ordinances.

Person(s) conducting open burning authorized by this permit must have a copy of the permit on site during permitted open burning operations.

ARS 13-1706. It is unlawful for any person, without lawful authority, to intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or with criminal negligence to set or cause to be set on fire any wildland other than the person's own or to permit a fire that was set or caused to be set by the person to pass from the person's own grounds to the grounds of another person. A person who violates this section is guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor, class 2 misdemeanor, class 3 felony, or class 6 felony.

A person may request the City to clarify its interpretation or application of a statute, ordinance, code, or policy affecting the processing of this application pursuant to A.R.S. § 9-839.

The Lake Havasu City Fire Department reserves the right to revoke this permit at any time.

Any public official may order that the burn be extinguished or may prohibit burning during periods of inadequate smoke dispersion, excessive visibility impairment, or extreme fire danger.

I certify that I have knowledge of the facts herein set forth, that the same are true, accurate and complete to the best of my knowledge and belief. I further state that I will assume responsibility for conducting open burning in accordance with the Arizona Administrative Code, Title 18, Chapter 2 and any open burning permit issued thereof. I acknowledge that all information not identified by me as confidential shall be treated by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality as a public record.
