

Mooring

There is no overnight mooring, between the hours of 11:00pm and 5:00am in the Bridgewater Channel and city parks pursuant to C.C. 8.16.130A, except, upon private property. The city parks include Rotary Community Park, London Bridge Beach, and Site Six.

Overnight mooring on the west bank is authorized at the private property of the Isle Condominiums. (1401 McCulloch Blvd N.) This is a private mooring area and not open to the general public. Also, there is private mooring at (1425 McCulloch Blvd N.) for Island Mall patrons.

The sections of the Bridgewater Channel and city parks marked in **RED** on the map below are **NO OVERNIGHT MOORING** zones.

There are also **RED** Emergency mooring zones in the Channel. These spaces must remain open at all times for police and emergency vessels only.

Required equipment for watercrafts

- All watercraft 16' or longer must have a USCG approved, Type IV throwable device.
- Must have at least one, appropriate sized USCG approved life jacket, Type I, II, III, or V for each person on board.
- Every vessel must carry an efficient sound producing device such as a horn, whistle, or bell.
- One B-1 Type USCG approved, hand portable fire extinguisher on vessels under 26 ft; 2 for 26'-40' vessels; and 3 for 40'-65' vessels.

The Bridgewater Channel is one of the busiest spots along the Colorado River. This is why our primary concern is the safety within the Channel.



Swimming in the channel is prohibited.

Swimming in or across the channel causes many navigation issues for boaters. This is very dangerous for swimmers. Boats do not have brakes like a car, and many boat operators are not as experienced in controlling their vessel to avoid a person swimming in the Channel. Our number one goal is to create a safe environment. When a swimmer is observed in the water, it requires police department resources to deal with the situation and remove the swimmer. This type of activity is a Misdemeanor offense. C.C. 8.16.150



Water Cannons or spraying any liquid from the shore towards a boat or from a boat towards the shore is strictly prohibited.



Spraying boats can cause interference with the operator of the boat. This type of activity could cause a boating crash and damage any water sensitive items. This is a Misdemeanor offense with a fine up to \$2,500.00 and the device is subject to seizure. C.C. 8.16.190

Throwing of footballs or any objects across the channel or towards boats is not permitted



Throwing any object towards a boat causes distractions to the boat operator and can lead to a boating accident. Occupants in a boat might try to catch the object and miss which carries a risk of them falling off the boat. As you can imagine, this could be a very dangerous situation. Also, some vessel occupants might try and reach into the water for a floating ball, increasing the risk of falling in. This type of activity is a Misdemeanor offense. C.C. 8.16.190

Glass containers are prohibited



Glass containers are prohibited in all Lake Havasu City parks and beaches. If broken, glass can produce sharp shards that may cause serious injuries to barefoot beach goers. Broken glass in water can be difficult to completely remove, posing an ongoing safety risk. This is a Misdemeanor offense. C.C. 11.06.370
