Transaction Privilege Tax (TPT) Collections Report

August 2025



This month's TPT Collection Report includes all collections through August (merchant collections through July 2025). The Arizona Department of Revenue provides tax collection information.

August collections were slightly below budget (-2.4%) but demonstrated strong year-over-year growth, \$197,244 (6.2%), primarily driven by Retail and Use Tax increases, which more than offset weaknesses in Accommodation and Rental/Leasing.

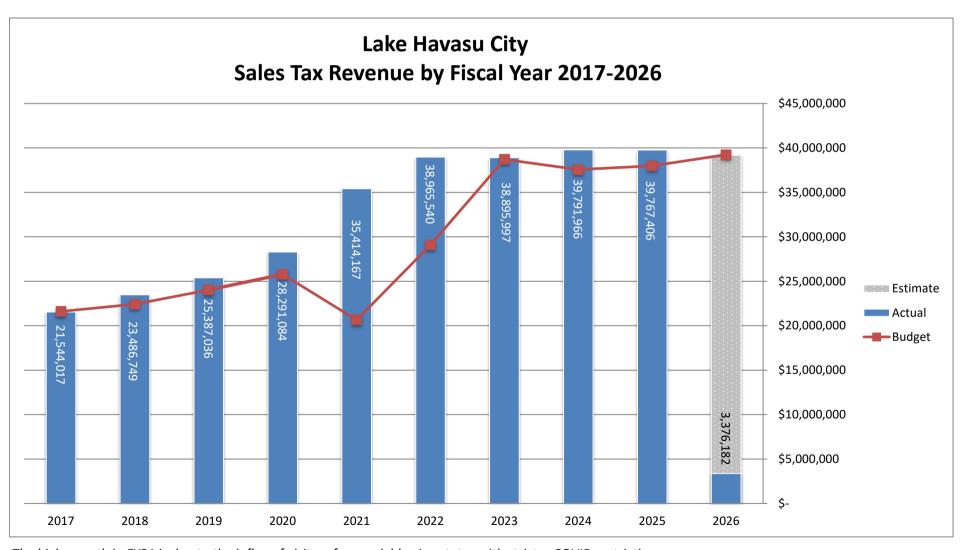

Year-to-date through August, TPT collections increased by \$197,244 (6.2%) compared to the same period in the prior year. The strongest gains were recorded in Retail, up \$199,250 (10.5%), followed by Construction, up \$13,428 (5.4%), and Restaurant & Bar, up \$8,866 (1.8%). Offsetting these increases were declines in several categories, most notably Accommodations, down \$34,046 (8.7%), Rental, down \$5,286 (7.8%), and Communications, down \$956 (2.3%).

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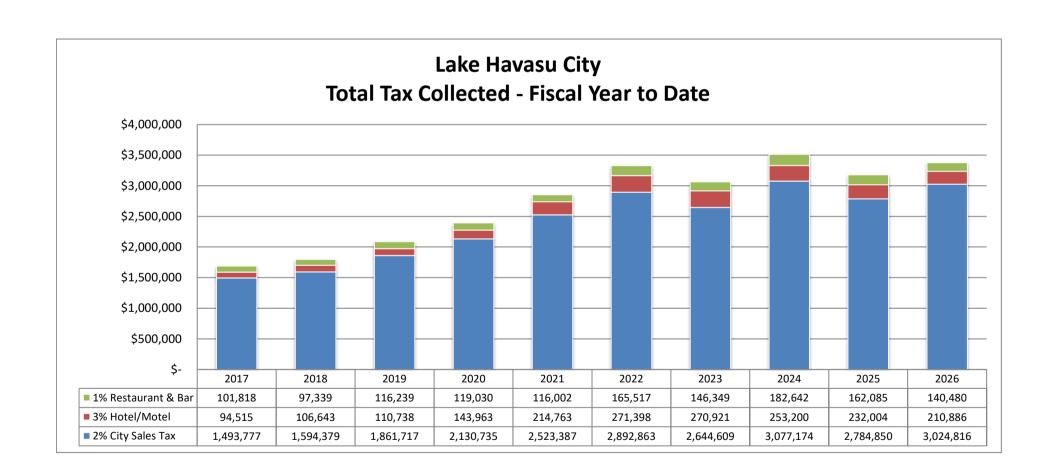




The high growth in FY21 is due to the influx of visitors from neighboring states with stricter COVID restrictions.

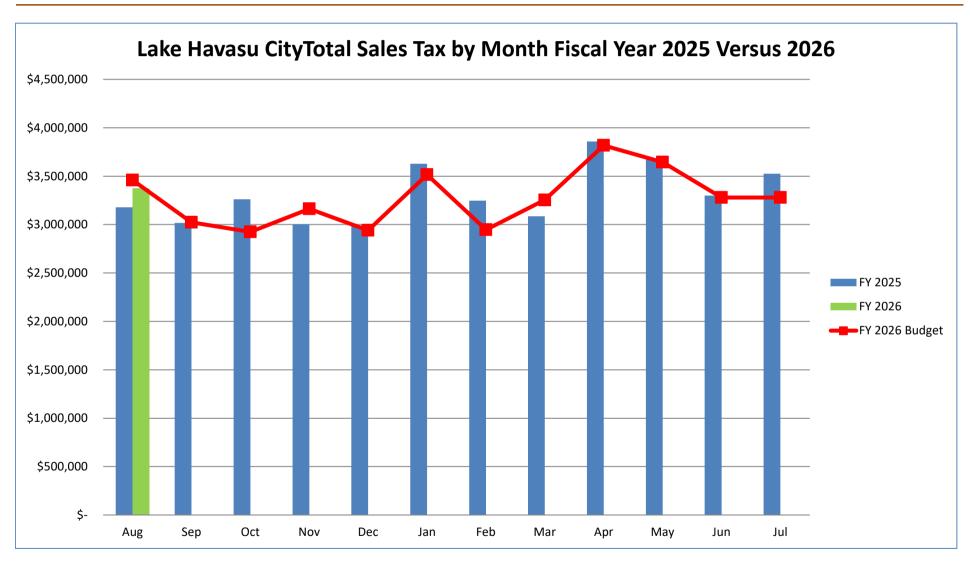
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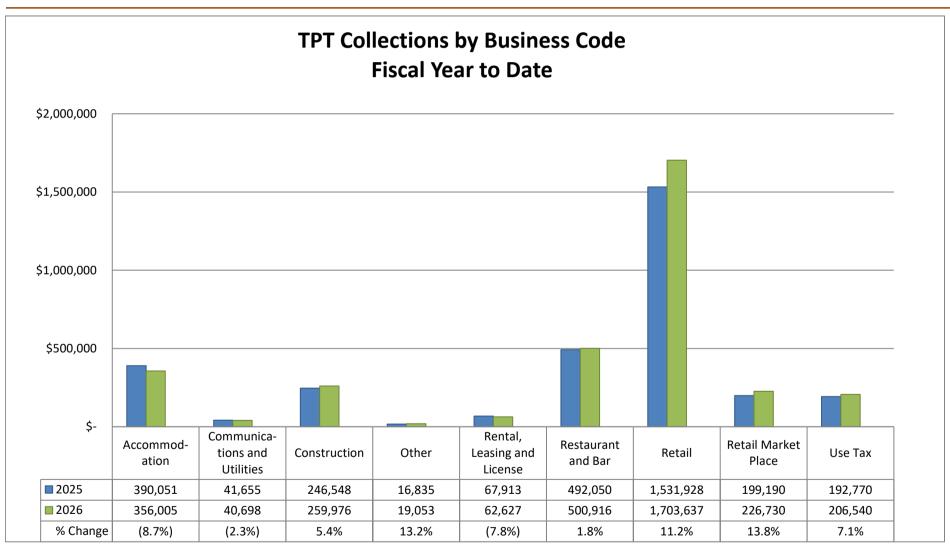
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Retail Sales

Retail sales are the most significant component of the City's overall TPT collections. In August, retail sales tax collections increased by \$199,250 (1.5%) from the previous year.

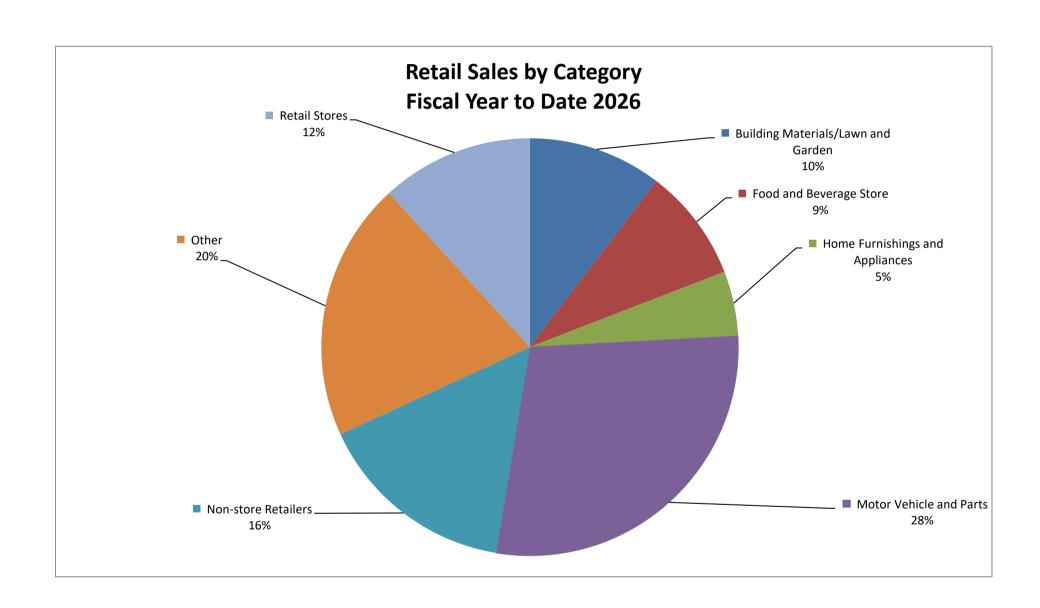

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Accommodations Plus Restaurant and Bar

Lake Havasu City collects a tax on Accommodations of 3.0% and Restaurant and Bar sales of 1.0%. The revenues generated support tourism and economic development. The Partnership of Economic Development (PED) receives \$500,000 annually, and Go Lake Havasu receives \$1.6 million annually.
