The Lake Havasu City Sales, Use and Accommodation Tax Report examines taxes collected during the month of August 2019 by businesses and vendors, which were reported and remitted to the Arizona Department of Revenue in September 2019. Tax collection information is provided by Arizona Department of Revenue.

Sales Tax

Fiscal Year to Date (FYTD) September 2019 sales tax collections are 9% above budget and 8% above prior year. The month of September is 4.4% above prior year.



Accommodations and Restaurant & Bar

Lake Havasu City collects an additional tax on accommodations (3%) and restaurant & bar sales (1%). The revenues generated by these additional taxes are disbursed to the Partnership for Economic Development (PED) (25%) and Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) (75%).

Fiscal Year to Date Payments to the PED and CVB have increased by 14.2%.
