This Month in Military History



January 25, 1945 - “The greatest American battle of the war” ends!

On December 16, 1944, the Germans embarked on Hitler’s last chance at victory - a winter offensive through a weak point in the Allied lines in the Ardennes. Under the cover of radio silence, night, and heavy winter weather, the Germans launched surprise attacks to separate the Allied Powers across Belgium.

While the Allies were confident in the war’s nearing end, the German offensive came as a shock. However, the grit and determination of the Allied forces held the German forces at bay. Members of the 394th Infantry Regiment at Lanzareth Ridge successfully denied the spearhead of the Kampfgruppe Peiper of the 1st SS Panzer Division for over 8 hours. This stand prevented 5,000 German soldiers from advancing through the line - creating a “bulge” in the line.

Over the course of 6 weeks, the Allies suffered great losses and great victories. With over 600,000 American troops participating in the largest battle ever fought by the US Army, approximately 80,000 casualties and 23,000 POWs resulted from the Battle of the Bulge.

On January 25, 1945, the Allies had successfully denied the German advancements and Hitler’s last chance at victory. This caused the Germans to retrograde back towards their homeland for the final stages of the war.
