# This Month in Military History



## April 1865 – The Confederacy’s Final Days

After years of war, the American Civil War finally nears its end in April 1865. This month brought turmoil to the Confederacy, ultimately leading to General Robert E. Lee’s retreat and surrendering at the Appomattox Court House.

On April 2, 1865, the 10-month Siege of Petersburg finally broke, allowing Union troops to capture the trenches around Petersburg, Virginia. What started in June 1864 and led to 9 months of trench warfare, Union forces finally forced Confederate forces and General Robert E. Lee to abandon the city. This siege foreshadowed the use of trench warfare, most notably used just 50 years later in World War I.

After fleeing from Petersburg, General Robert E. Lee and his Cabinet arrived in the Confederate capital of Richmond, Virginia. Just one day later, the capital fell to Union forces. There were multiple attempts to capture the Confederate capital throughout the war, yet none were successful. Due to the successful siege and takeover of Petersburg, the Confederate soldiers abandoned Richmond, burning supplies to avoid use and capture by the Union soldiers. This abandonment of the city sealed the Confederate forces fate in the Civil War.

Not even one day later on April 4, 1865, President Abraham Lincoln visits Richmond with a small group of soldiers and freed slaves. The group walked to the Confederate White House and sat in Confederate President Jefferson Davis’s chair. After a few days in Richmond, President Lincoln returned to Washington. Days after Lee’s surrender at the Appomattox Court House, President Lincoln was shot by John Wilkes Booth in Ford Theatre on April 14, 1865.
