

MOPED

A Moped is a bicycle that has a helper motor. It must have pedals and be capable of operating as a bicycle. The maximum speed is 25 mph. When the motor is engaged, operators must have a driver license, registration (\$5.00 decal from MVD), and insurance. Mopeds may drive on the roadway, but not in bike paths when the motor is engaged. The driver must obey all traffic laws.

MOTORIZED SCOOTERS

Motorized scooters are self-propelled devices with a motor, deck, and two tandem wheels (one in front of the other) in contact with the ground.

Motorized scooters are not motor vehicles, but riders must obey all traffic laws in addition to City Codes that restrict their operation. No driver's license, registration, or insurance is required.

BICYCLES

Bicycles have three or fewer wheels, are human powered, and include racing wheelchairs. Riders are granted all the rights and are subject to all motor vehicle laws while operating on the roadway. Riders must ride on the right side of the roadway, in designated bike lanes or sidewalks. At night, bicycles must have a white light on the front and a red reflector on the rear. A functional brake is required.

ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE DEVICE

Self-balancing one or two non-tandem wheeled devices with a motor traveling at a maximum speed of 15 mph, and only transports one person. Persons under 16 shall not operate these devices. Riders must follow laws regarding pedestrians and may travel on private property, sidewalks, and crosswalks. Driver's license, registration, and insurance are not required.

ELECTRIC BICYCLES

E-bicycles or tricycles have an electric motor. They are granted all the rights and privileges and are subject to all the laws of persons on E-bicycles. driver's license, registration, and insurance are not required. E-Bicycles are not a "vehicle" per Title 28, so DUI does not apply. E-bicycles have three classes:

- Class 1 - Motor only assists while pedaling and cuts out at 20 mph. (May use bicycle and multi-use paths)
- Class 2 - Motor may power without pedaling and cuts out at 20 mph. (May use bicycle and multi-use paths)
- Class 3 - Motor only assists while pedaling and cuts out at 28 mph. (May not use bicycle & multi-use paths unless adjacent to a highway)

GOLF CART

A golf cart is a motor vehicle with no less than three wheels capable of a speed no greater than 25 mph and carrying no more than four people, including the driver. There is no legal requirement except DUI, reckless driving, and accidents on private property such as golf courses. This includes crossing the roadway incident to play golf. A neighborhood electric vehicle must be emission free, carry four or fewer persons, operate at less than 25 mph, and have four wheels. It shall not operate on a roadway posted at more than 35 mph, except to cross such a road. Must be registered and insured, and the driver must have a driver's license if operated on the roadway.

- MOTORCYCLES CONTINUED
- Surface street must have two or more lanes in the same direction.
- May not pass a vehicle in motion.
- Max speed of 15 mph.

An ATV is a motor vehicle designed primarily for recreational non-highway all-terrain travel.

ATVs have two categories:

protective structure, and occupant restraint system.

MOTORCYCLES

(Neighborhood Electric Vehicle)

Motorcycles have a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and are designed to travel with not more than three wheels in contact with the ground. Riders must have a valid driver's license with motorcycle endorsement, registration, insurance, and eye protection. Riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet. Motorcycles are permitted on the roadway and must obey all traffic laws as any other vehicle on the roadway. Splitting traffic in Arizona is illegal but lane filtering is legal (see next section).
